In August 2019, the Faith and Disability Initiative grew into the Wheaton Center for Faith and Disability (www.wheaton.edu/faithanddisability) and after additional foundation laying and infrastructure building, publicly launched in Spring 2022. This Center, one of the first of its kind, is dedicated to helping Wheaton College become a leading voice to address disability through a biblical lens.

Through various collaborations, multiple events were held at Wheaton College in 2018-2019 to launch a new initiative focusing on the intersection of disability and faith. These events included working group meetings, multiple lectures, and an invitation only Faith and Disability Symposium. This Symposium gathered 19 thought leaders from around the world and resulted in two special issues of the Journal of Disability and Religion, a manuscript currently in press, 30 lighting talks for Wheaton faculty to use in their

classes, and a growing network of international leaders to undergird the growing commitment and work at Wheaton College to address disability through a biblical lens.
