- <sup>2</sup> For students who cannot spend a semester away from campus e.g., varsity athletes, engineering/nursing students there are immersive summer programs available through GPS that can meet the requirements for the Culture Immersion component of the Anthropology Major. Most "Wheaton In" summer travel programs, while providing excellent exposure to language and various topics, do not meet this requirement.
- <sup>3</sup> Students may take anthropology elective credit *any* semester, but should note that at least FOUR (4) credits must be at the 400 level. Also, anthropology majors may count up to FOUR (4) credits of SOC toward the required 16 elective credits in the major. Most study abroad programs include courses that are focused on the cultural context of the programs location, and those are usually transferred to Wheaton as ANTH credits. Up to EIGHT (8) credits from an off-campus program may be part of the required SIXTEEN (16) elective credits.
- <sup>4</sup> The Human Origins requirement can be met with either SCI 301 (Fall only) or SCI 311 (Spring only) or BIOL 243.
