At least 12 of the 24 PHIL credits must be upper division (300 or 400 level). 12 credits of the integrated field may be counted as requirements for a double major. See the course catalog for the many paths of a Philosophy major.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Students can choose to take the 2-credit PHIL 243 (Intro to Logic) or 4-credit PHIL 245 (Logic) to meet the requirement. PHIL 243 is the first half of the PHIL 245 class, and both are offered every semester.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup>PHIL 311 and 312 (History of Philosophy) do not have to be taken in that order.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> PHIL 494 (Capstone) is offered in fall and spring semesters and should be taken in the senior year.
