 - Beginning and intermediate level offerings in other classical languages (GREK/LATN/HEBR 101, 102, 201)
 - Other CL approved advanced exegesis (BITH 532, 635, 636, 646, 647) or classical language courses offered in the Graduate School.

- -After 201 (competency), all upper level courses are open to students. Greek Herodotus, Homer (Iliad & Odyssey), Sophocles, Plato; Adv. Latin Readings; Hebrew texts (canonical and extra-canonical)
