<sup>1</sup> Courses that meet CATC tags: Many elective courses for the Interdisciplinary Studies programs carry Thematic Core tags.

<sup>2</sup> Students accepted to the Interdisciplinary Studies major (a selective program) create an approved **Program of Study (POS)** to plan their upper-division courses across two or three academic disciplines: two disciplines require at least 12 upper-division credit hours each (24 total); three disciplines require at least 8 upper-division credit hours each (24 total). One of the upper-division courses must be approved as an integrative or bridge course, clearly linking the chosen disciplines in the program of study thematically.

-Students may apply to the IDS program after 30 credit hours have been completed. See the program website for details on the application process.

-Internship hours do not apply directly towards the major. An IDS Internship is not required, but is encouraged as appropriate.
