¹ Courses that meet the CATC Core Shared Core requirement: ARCH 211 (Old Testament), ARCH 213 (New Testament), BITH 211(Old Testament), BITH 213 (New Testament), BITH 312 (Old Testament in the Holy Lands)⁷, BITH 317 (New Testament in the Holy Lands)⁷, BITH 318 (Christian Theology in the Holy Lands)⁷, BITH 221 (Old Testament), and BITH 374 (in lieu of BITH 315: Christian Thought). Many electives meet Thematic Core requirements. A maximum of three may count for both the BITH major and the CATC requirements.

² Although not required for the BITH major, students are encouraged to take either Greek or Hebrew. These courses may be used to fulfill the Christ at the Core Language Competency requirement.

³ The 16 credit hours of electives must include coursework in Biblical Studies (4), Theology (4), and Religion (REL) (4).

⁴ Wheaton in the Holy Lands is an 8 credit study abroad program. Depending on the year and the student need, the credits can be used to meet CATC requirements (Old Testament or New Testament, and Christian Theology), or elective requirements for the Biblical and Theological Studies major.
