



## Guidelines for Transferring courses to meet Christ at the Core™ requirements

Students who take either dual enrollment courses or plan to take courses outside of Wheaton can use this guide to help determine how courses might transfer as part of Wheaton's Christ at the Core (CATC) general education requirement. Current Wheaton students require preapproval for any course they plan to transfer back to Wheaton College. Current students should use the Transfer Course Approval form located on the forms page of the Registrar's website.

<b>Requirement</b>	<b>Courses that can be transferred for this requirement</b>
<b>Core Competencies</b>	
First-Year Writing	At most Community Colleges this will be Composition 1 AND Composition 2 to meet this requirement. From a 4 year college, both Composition 1 and 2 are required if both are offered. The course must be a writing course(s) that has a significant research project and covers library research skills.
Oral Communication	Usually a public speaking course would meet this requirement. A students should be preparing and delivering various kinds of speeches as a class requirement. This course must be taken in person, not online.
Modern and Classical Language	Please see the Modern and Classical Languages website for detailed information on meeting the langauge requirement. Language courses must be taken in person; online courses are not allowable.
Wellness	Course must have nutrition, exercise, emotional health, public health and disease prevention components, as well as required health logs.

<b>SHARED CORE</b>	<b><i>Shared Core courses may not be transferred, except by transfer students who were matriculated students at a CCCU School. Courses taken for dual enrollment credit will not be considered for Shared Core credit.</i></b>
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<b>THEMATIC CORE</b>	<b><i>A maximum of 4 themes may be met with transfer credit for BA or BS students. Each transfer course may receive only one theme. BM and BME seeking students are limited to 1 theme that may be met with transfer credit. Junior transfer students (60 hours or more of eligible transfer credit) who are seeking a BA or BS may earn up to 6 themes prior to starting classes at Wheaton College. Please check with Academic Advising. Current students should check Degree Works before submission of Transfer Approval Form for themes already met with transfer credit. Current students will not be given approval for transferring in more than 4 themes after matricluation.</i></b>
Applied Abstract & Quantitative Reasonings (AAQR)	Finite Math, Pre-calculus, Elementary/Introduction to Statistics, Applied Calculus, Calculus I
Diversity in the US (DUS)	Race and Social Justice in US
Global Perspectives (GP)	Modern Korean History
Historical Perspectives (HP)	World History Ancient to Modern, World History 1600-present
Literary Explorations (LE)	Introduction to Literature, World/Global Literature, Classical/Early British Lit
Philosophical Investigations (PI)	Introduction to Philosophy
Scientific Issues & Perspectives (SIP)	Introduction to Astronomy, Environmental Issues
Scientific Practice (SP)	Principles of Biology, Introductory or General Physics, Introduction to Geology/Earth Science. All must have a 3 hour per week lab component done in person in a laboratory.

Social Inquiry (SI)	Introduction to Anthropology, Principles of Microeconomics, American Politics & Government, Introduction to Political Philosophy, Comparative Politics, International Relations, Introduction to Sociology
Visual & Performing Arts (VPA)	Art Appreciation, Music Appreciation, Global Music Survey. Studio art courses cannot be taken elsewhere to meet this theme.

*CURRENT STUDENTS: A Transfer Approval Form must be submitted to the Academic Advising Office for pre-approval for any course to be taken at another school. Courses for a major, minor or certificate must have department approval.*
