Collection 29: Ephemera of Billy Sunday	2	Newspaper clippings, bulletins, counselor training materials, promotional pieces, correspondence, audio tapes, photographs, postcards, scrapbooks, and a film relating to Sunday's ministry as an evangelist and Homer Rodeheaver's publishing activity. One scrapbook, from the 1915 Omaha evangelistic meeting, is on microfilm.
Collection 31: Ephemera of John Wesley	1	One autographed letter, signed by Wesley to "Sammy," written while he was in London during October 1782. Several newspaper clippings and a scrapbook of clippings relating to the 100th anniversary of Wesley's death. The scrapbook is on microfilm
Collection 35: Papers of Fanny Crosby	2	Thousands of manuscripts of lyrics dictated by Crosby, poet and writer of hymns. Most of the manuscripts are numbered and dated. This collection is also on microfilm.
Collection 38: Ephemera of Paul Rader	5	Newsletters, sermon manuscripts, scrapbooks, programs, pamphlets, brochures, a taped sermon, and a videotape copy of a 1928 film, etc., documenting the career of evangelist Rader. The material deals mostly with his radio work and the church he founded, the Chicago Gospel Tabernacle. Additional material includes sermons of preachers who spoke at the Tabernacle, newsletters and magazines published by Rader, and newspaper clippings and articles about Rader. Much of the collection is on microfilm.
Collection 47: Papers of Mel Trotter	3	Correspondence, annual reports, newspaper clippings, sermon notes, photographs, audio tape, and memorabilia related to the life and work of evangelist and rescue mission worker Mel Trotter. Most of the collection is on microfilm
Collection 048: Records of Youth for Christ	28	Note: Only a portion of this collection has been microfilmed and is available for interlibrary loan. Correspondence, minutes of meetings, clippings, newsletters, manuals, press releases, audio and video tapes, photographs, phonograph records, posters, yearbooks, and more about the founding, development, and activities of YFC, an organization involved in evangelism and nurture among high school age people. Also included are copies of a YFC television special and its radio program REALITY. Only parts of boxes 1, 9 and 20 and all of boxes 10-19 have been microfilmed and are available for interlibrary loan.
Collection 061: Papers of Billy and Amelia Sunday	29	Several hundred photographs and 29 reels of microfilm containing correspondence, sermons, reports, revival ephemera, and scrapbooks dealing mainly with the career of evangelist Billy Sunday from its beginning to his death and with the work of his wife Helen, who besides acting as his general manager, was a fundamentalist leader in her own right, especially after his death. The collection also contains information about the Prohibition movement in America and life on the home front during World War I.

Collection 81: <u>Records of Africa</u> <u>Inland Mission</u>	83	Only boxes 1 through 23 of this collection have been microfilmed and are available for interlibrary loan. Correspondence, minutes, reports, personnel files, photographs, slides, audio tapes, etc., relating to the mission's work in Africa from its founding. Documents describe the process of recruiting and training missionaries, contacts between the AIM boards in the United States, Canada, Great Britain, Australia, South Africa, and other countries; development of an administrative structure; relations with other missions,; development of the Africa Inland Church; changes in Africa and African Christianity following the independence of African nations from colonial status; and the work in Kenya, Uganda, Zaire, Tanzania, Sudan, the Central African Republic, and other countries. Hundreds of tapes of AIM's radio program, LETTER FROM AFRICA, are also included.
Collection 87: Papers of Frederick Franson	2	Microfilm of xeroxed material collected by Rev. Edward P. Torjesen on the life and ministry of Franson, nineteenth-century missionary and evangelist. Materials include articles, in several languages, written by or about Franson.
Collection 103: Papers of Aimee Semple McPherson	22	Sermon transcripts, sermon notes, films, phonograph records, audio tapes, newspaper clippings, scrapbooks, a video tape, and evangelistic campaign material related to McPherson's career as an evangelist, radio speaker, and church founder. Almost all of this collection is on microfilm
Collection 106: Ephemera of Henry Wellington Stough	1	Sermon notes, autobiographical manuscript, photographs, a microfilmed scrapbook of Stough's campaigns in Altoona and Lancaster, Pennsylvania, 1915, and a xeroxed copy of a scrapbook of newspaper clippings and pamphlets from the Evansville, Indiana, 1916 campaign. One photo is of Stough with William Jennings Bryan.
Collection 107: Papers of Reuben Archer Torrey, Sr.	2	Note: Only the diaries in boxes 3 and 4 of this collection have been microfilmed and are available for interlibrary loan. Diaries, correspondence, sermon notes, Sunday school lessons, newspaper clippings, brochures, memorial booklet, photographs, diaries, audio tapes, and glass negatives from Torrey's career as evangelist, teacher, author, and family man.
Collection 118: Ephemera of Mordecai Ham	2	Newspaper clippings, oral history interviews with Vernon Patterson and Grady Wilson, and microfilm of sermon notebooks, all relating to the career of evangelist Mordecai Ham
Collection 138: Ephemera of Hymn Writers and Composers	1	Microfilm of a scrapbook containing miscellaneous correspondence, photographs, and memorabilia by and about hymn writers and composers. Included are Cliff Barrows, Merrill Dunlop, Lowell Mason, Homer Rodeheaver, Ira Sankey, George Stebbins, and others.

Collection 330: Records of Moody Church	8	Correspondence, reports, scrapbooks, church bulletins, minutes of meetings, and other records of the influential independent Chicago church started by Dwight L. Moody during the Civil War. The collection includes records from all phases of the church's history, but most of the materials are from roughly 1910 through 1946. Worship services, Sunday School, the governance of the body, and various urban outreach programs of the church are all documented. Besides the history of the church, the collection also contains material on such topics as American home and foreign missions during the first half of the twentieth century; the life and ministries of A. C. Dixon, Paul Rader, P. W. Philpott, and Harry A. Ironside; and the beliefs and practice of American Fundamentalism and Evangelicalism. A large part of this collection is on microfilm, including the minutes of the church's executive committee and several large scrapbooks of the church's handbills, brochures, clippings, and other publications.
Collection 341: Papers of Victor Plymire	2	Letters, articles, photos, maps, diary, and other material relating to the career of Assemblies of God missionary Plymire. The collection contains information not only on his evangelistic work among various strata of Tibetan society but also about his evangelistic/exploration expedition of 1927-28 which crossed from northeastern to southwestern Tibet; Tibetan culture and society; and the Buddhist religion. Most of this collection has been microfilmed.
Collection 379: Records of the Woman's Union Missionary Society	3	Only boxes 29-30, containing the WUMS annual reports (1860- 1958) and some legal files, have been microfilmed are available for interlibrary loan. Records of the Woman's Union Missionary Society, known after 1972 as United Fellowship for Christian Service. Founded in 1860 by Mrs. Thomas C. Doremus, it was intended as a vehicle for sending single women as missionaries to women in closed societies (and therefore unreachable by male missionaries) in Asia. The materials consist of correspondence, reports, personnel files, legal documents, financial files, scrapbooks, and photographs, documenting their medical and educational work in Burma, China, India, Pakistan, and Japan. About 1975 the organization dissolved due to financial difficulties and became part of Bible and Medical Missionary Fellowship.
Collection 590: Papers of John R. W. Stott	4	Correspondence, memos, reports, notes, magazine and newspaper clippings, brochures and other materials relating to John R. W. Stott's involvement in the 1974 Lausanne Congress and the Lausanne movement that developed out of it. The collection is particularly in strong in material relating to Stott's membership on the Lausanne Committee for World Evangelization and its executive committee; his contribution to drafting several of the movement's major statements; his chairmanship of the Lausanne Theology and Education Group and the consultations it sponsored; and his participation in the preparation of Lausanne books and other publications.
