Not only have they developed strong, versatile skills through their liberal arts education, but they are joining the deeply connected Wheaton network with opportunities to engage with alumni all over the globe who are eager to share their wisdom and insight.


We have been tremendously proud of the Class of 2022 as my colleagues and I have journeyed with them during their years at Wheaton. These graduates spent two years of their Wheaton education pivoting during in a global pandemic, and they demonstrated the kind of grit, tenacity, and grace that will serve them well as young alumni.

### Survey Methodology

This survey is conducted according to guidelines from the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), the professional association for college career services. NACE's First Destination Survey captures information on how new college graduates fare in their careers within six months of graduation. The annual initiative provides clear, concise, and consistent data on the outcomes associated with a college education on a national scale (naceweb.org). In addition to providing outcomes for specific graduating classes, the First Destination Survey is designed to provide data trends over time to inform the discussion about the value of higher education. The standards and protocols allow collection of information from an electronic survey conducted by the Center for Vocation and Career, as well as job information from sources like LinkedIn.

# **CLASS OF 2022 FIRST DESTINATION SURVEY RESULTS**





As a resident assistant in the fall of 2020, Justin discovered the value of working hard and trusting God, even in the midst of a global pandemic. Reflecting on that year, he said, "In hard times, you can turn to the world, or you can turn to God." His Residence Life team inspired him to remain faithful to his work and continue to look ahead in hope. With a desire to start a career in finance and business, Justin wasn't sure how his liberal arts degree would translate when applying for jobs. But one business/ economics class, co-taught by Wheaton alumni in the consulting and venture capital funding fields, helped him gain the confidence he needed to articulate how his major, experience as an RA and Student Ambassador, and liberal arts education prepared him to add value to potential employers. With a referral by a Wheaton faculty member, Justin landed a position as an analyst at JP Morgan Chase where he continues to lean into his faith as he adapts to the steep learning curve of investment banking. 



Majors: Geology and Spanish Landed: Staff Geophysicist at GEI Consultants

When he wasn't outside piloting drones to make orthomosaic maps, practicing his Spanish language skills, or serving as captain on the varsity soccer team, Hasten could often be found in the basement of Meyer Science Center for the Geology Department's Earth Club, listening and learning from fellow students and alumni pursuing careers in earth science. When asked why he chose to study geology, he explained, "I love science and I love being outdoors. Geology lets me do different things every day. I'm able to be in the office or be out in the field, and I get to travel to incredible places." For Hasten, the tight-knit feel of the Geology department and the top-notch professors helped solidify this love. After spending a few months at an environmental consulting firm, Hasten is now a staff geophysicist at GEI Consultants, which he found through a LinkedIn connection. He puts his geophysics studies, geological testing experience, Spanish ability, and even his drone piloting skills to work each day, working alongside structural engineers. #### Majors: English and Secondary Education Landed: High School English Teacher at Rauner College Prep

During her time at Wheaton, Monik flexed her creative skills in various ways: as a photographer wherever needed, as the opinion section editor of the student newspaper The Record, and as the graphic designer for College Union. She also served in various roles for Unidad Cristiana, Wheaton's Latino community, and ended her time at Wheaton as president of Unidad. In the summers, she worked as a teaching assistant with BRIDGE, where she worked with underrepresented minority and first-generation high school students. In every role she served in, her goal was to keep BIPOC individuals and "our voices" at the forefront. These experiences have been vital as she has stepped into her role as an English teacher at Rauner College Prep, a Chicago charter school. This year, Monik has been tasked with teaching a brand new course on African American and Latin-American literature for 11th graders. In this role, she has become particularly thankful for her English teachers that went beyond the traditional English canon. Taking from some of her classes at Wheaton, she teaches authors like James Baldwin, August Wilson, and Elizabeth Acevedo. Her advice to current students is "When looking for jobs, know the Lord will bring you to the right place."
