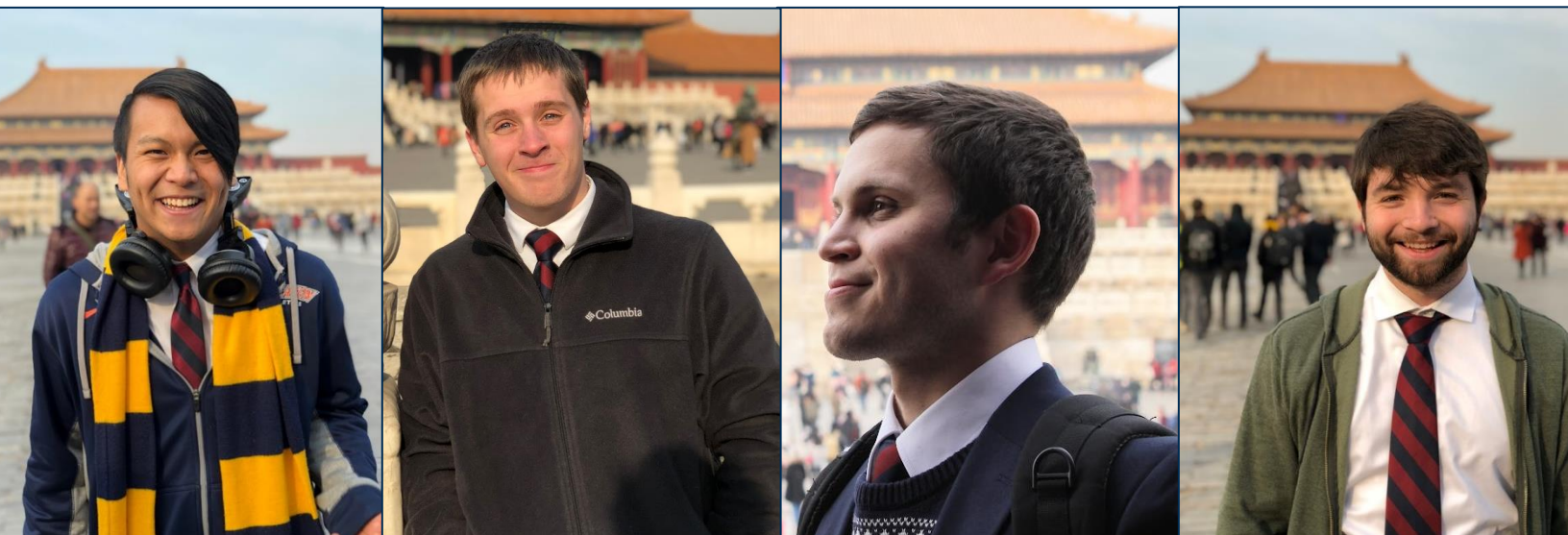

## STORIES FROM CHINA TOUR 2017

“Being a part of the Men’s Glee Club’s China Tour this November was one of the best experiences I have had while at Wheaton College. I have little international experience and have never left the United States for musical purposes, so this trip was such an amazing opportunity. Because of this, it is really difficult to identify a sole moment on the trip as my favorite. As a group, we were able to see so many amazing sites, and meet some fantastic people. However, if I were forced to single out a moment on the trip that I will treasure the most, I would have to say it came during our tour of the Forbidden City.

The tour itself was fantastic, walking where former Emperors carried out their days was amazing, and to be immersed into that history was incredible. However, that experience pales in comparison to a moment that occurred later in the tour.

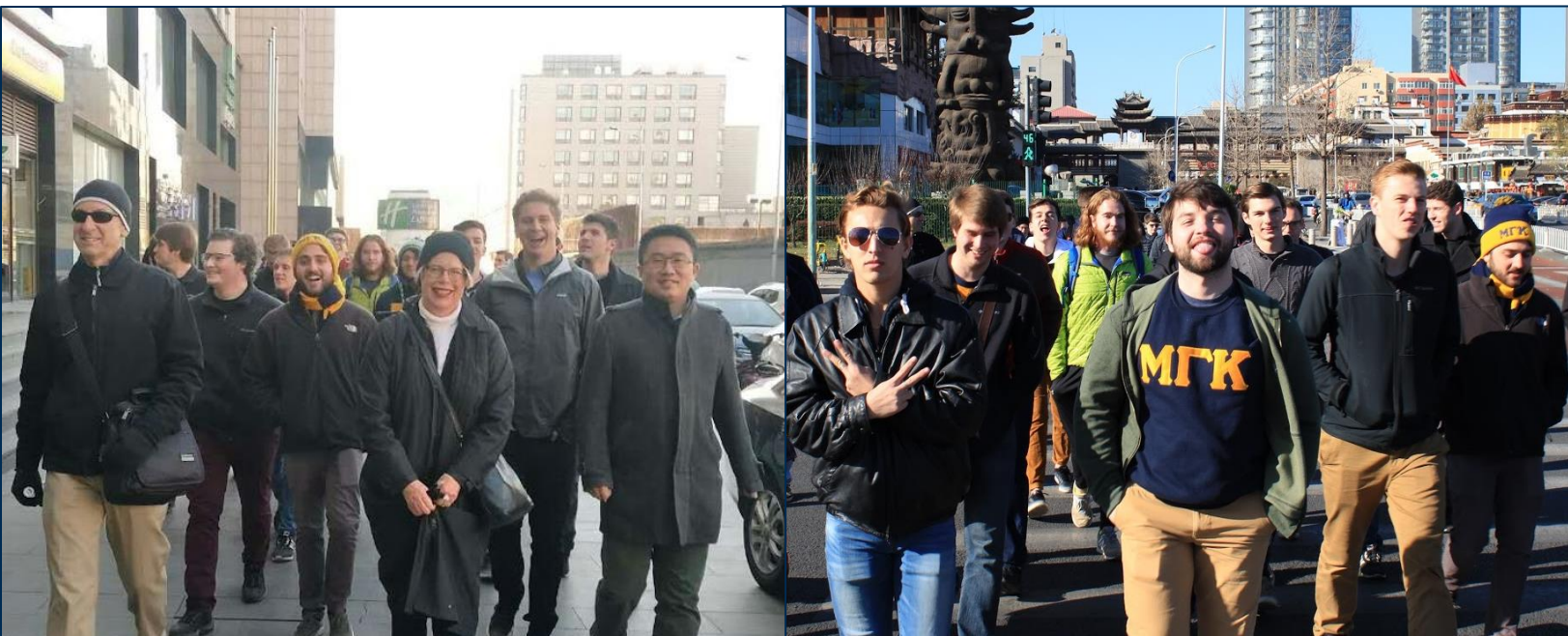
As our tour was concluding, we took a moment to see the Forbidden City’s Opera House. While basking in the glory of this beautiful building, Dr. Hopper had the wonderful idea (she tends to have a lot of those) that we should sing a piece at the steps of this opera house. We assembled together and performed *E’en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come*. At first, there were only a few citizens and tourists with us at the Opera House, but as our singing continued, the size of our crowd swelled.

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In that moment, it occurred to me that we were singing a song proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ, in the center of the Forbidden City, which housed dynasties that subscribed to Taoism and Buddhism, in the middle of the capital of China, where the name of Jesus is not often heard.

This single moment opened my eyes to the rarity of what we as a club were able to do during this trip. That is, proclaim the gospel through song in places that rarely have the opportunity to hear the good news. I am grateful that I was able to make this observation in the midst of the trip, rather than upon reflection once our work was done. It helped me keep the right mindset as we went about our performances and travel.”

“My favorite moment during the China tour came during one of our first days there. We attended a Mandarin church service at an international church in Beijing. They sang the doxology as one of their worship songs and it was awesome to sing along with them in English while they sang in Mandarin. But the moment that really hit me came at the end.

We happened to be there in a day in which *over 40 people* were baptized at the church. Seeing these people be so excited in their new lives really reminded me that the body of Christ is global. We'll live our entire lives a world apart, but these newly baptized Christians are brothers and sisters with us for the rest of eternity. That was the best moment of the entire trip for me.”

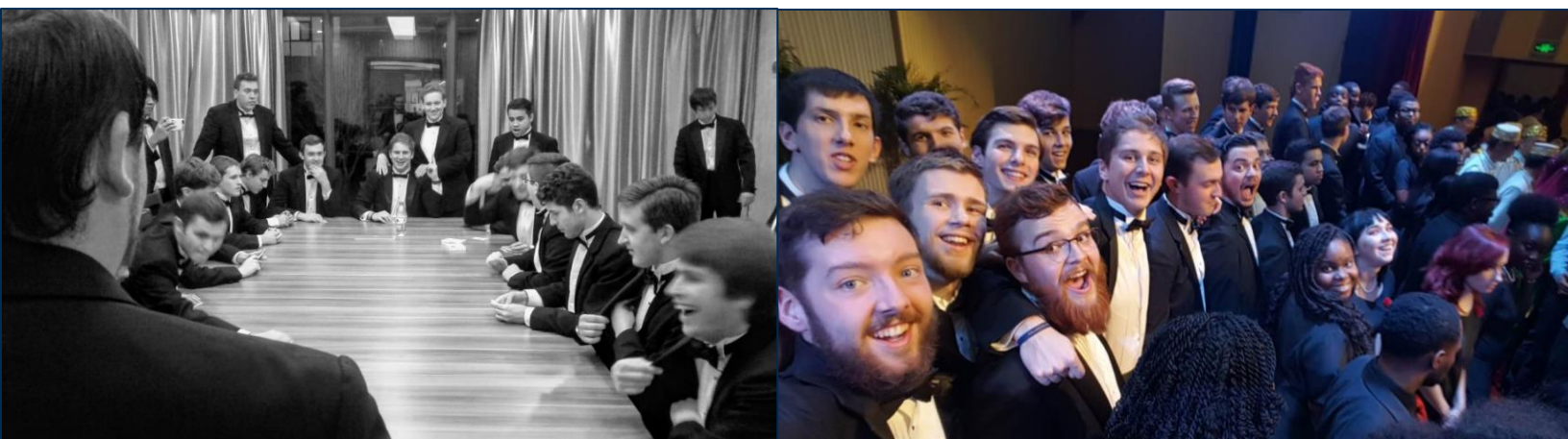


## Aiden Smith, '18

However, the differences were not what amazed me - it was the similarities that blew me away.

The unifying power of music was palpable at these concerts. I couldn't speak their language. I did not look like them. They grew up on different parts of the globe, and my life probably looked absolutely nothing like theirs. Yet, when I watched them make music I understood them, at least partially. I connected with people I may never have connected to in any other way. This moment of connection, minute and seemingly insignificant was filled with meaning. This made the experience a once in a lifetime encounter with other cultures and peoples.”



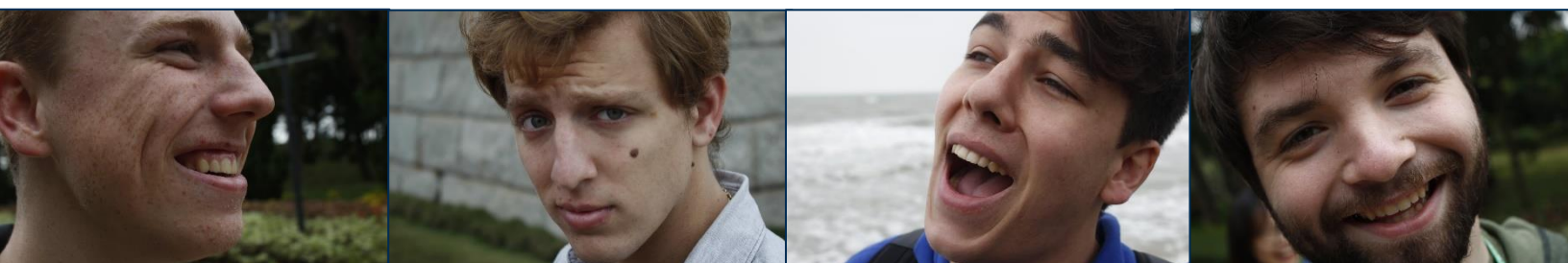


## Michael Smith, '20

Successful nominees will meet the following criteria:

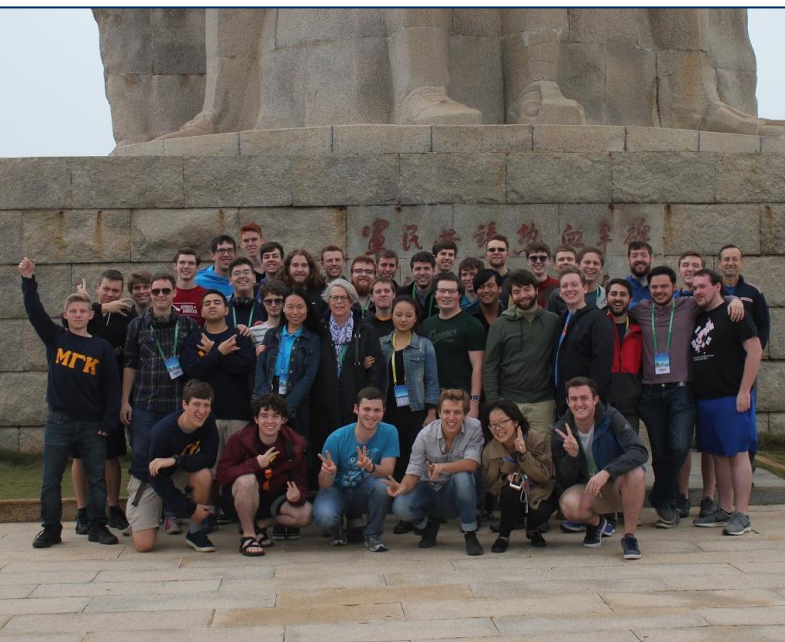
- Was formally identified as an "Old Man" during his time as a student member of the Men's Glee Club;
