LETTER FROM PROFESSOR JOHN SWEDBERG



Greetings, Old Men!

I am thrilled and honored to be joining the Wheaton College Men's Glee Club as conductor this fall. We have already hit the ground running with rehearsals, cabinet meetings, and the Homecoming Week festivities, where I enjoyed meeting many of you. The Club's joy and camaraderie have inspired me. Few things build brotherhood like shared traditions, and I have already enjoyed discovering many of the Club's great traditions. I haven't gotten a chance to play Rook here yet, but I used to play it almost every night in the dorms as an undergraduate, so I look forward to knocking the rust off that old skill set! Significantly, it is clear that the men

in this group enjoy hanging out together. This type of fellowship honors God and is good for its own sake, and I am also convinced that it helps us sing better!

I come to Wheaton by way of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, where I am wrapping up a doctorate in Choral Music. FINANCIAL REPORT: JUNE 30, 2023 - JULY 1, 2024

The 2023-24 financial year saw the creation of the Old Man Association general fund. The fund pays for the OMA's basic operating expenses and the Four-Year-Man award scholarship and defrays costs for club members that may otherwise prohibit or discourage them from joining the MGC.

In November 2023, the OMA sent a postcard and accompanying email to all Old Men, announcing the fund's establishment and asking them to consider an annual gift of \$25. Below is a summary of the OMA's cash flow for the year.

A portion of these funds are available to current Glee Club members for whom concert attire and MGC course fees pose a financial hardship. We will report on the utilization of these resources in future issues.
