Gene Frost Sr. - Old Man of the Year 2018

Gene Frost Sr. graduated from Wheaton in 1943 and sang in the Glee Club under the Direction of our fourth Director, Uncle Bill Nordin. One of the Presidents of the Glee Club during that time was Hudson T. Armerding, who would go on to become President of the College during the 60s and 70s. Mr. Frost was also close friends with Billy Graham, who would reportedly ask him to watch out for Ruth when he went on evangelistic tours.

After graduating, he served his country as a Chaplain in the Navy during World War II, and then went on to serve the Kingdom of God as a



pastor in Illinois for 66 years, finally retiring at the age of 91. But even though he retired, he continues to teach Sunday School each week, even at the age of 98. Showing that through God all things are possible.

<u>Gregg Garman - Newest Board Member</u>

Gregg Garman graduated from Wheaton College (IL) in 1971 with a B. A. in Elementary Education. Gregg earned a M. Ed. Degree in Educational Administration from McDaniel College (MD) in 1975 and has studied in the doctorate program in Educational Leadership at Lehigh University (PA). Gregg has a passion for impacting children, teenagers, and young adults for Christ and His kingdom. During his 45+ years in the field of education, Mr. Garman has served in the following positions: Elementary Teacher,



Elementary Principal, Executive Director of Camp Joy El, MS/HS Principal, Headmaster, Professor of Education at Cairn University (PA). His most recent positions were in South Korea where he served two years as a Teacher of English and Bible to Korean university students, six years as Elementary Assistant Principal at Yongsan International School of Seoul, and two years at International Christian School – Pyeongtaek.

"I loved my four years in Men's Glee Club! I was able to go on all long tours as most short tours. I was privileged to be a Second Tenor Part Leader (Tenors are the best, you know!). I enjoyed serving the Club as Social Chairman one year and Business Manager one year. Being selected for two European Men's Glee Tours (1968 and 1970) were amazing experiences with a tremendous group of men! I learned so much under the leadership of Dr. Clayton Halvorsen! Much of what I learned from him, I used in several choirs I have directed. It is a real joy and privilege to be selected to serve on this Board and give back just a little of what I gained through the four fantastic years I enjoyed."
