Breaking through the Boundaries: God's Mission from the Outside In

“Robert L. Gallagher in chapter 4 presents an interesting aspect of the contemporary discussion on mission and migration. He thinks that the Gittite was possibly a convert to David's God (see 2 Sam. 15:18-22), as Ittai uses Israel's religious language ('as the LORD lives;' v. 21). The author's conclusion is that 'David started out killing Philistines; he ends up converting them!' (90).

In reflecting on the connections of God with Peter and Cornelius (Ch. 8), Gallagher argues that the mission of God involves both God's people 'in prayerful trust and obedience' and perhaps also people beyond the borders of the church (147). As Peter, years after the Pentecost and the birth of a Christian community, was still following daily Jewish rituals of prayer, God used the 'Italian immigrant' Cornelius to break the boundaries of religious and cultural superiority of God's people (Acts 10). The two men needed each other to understand better God's purposes. In the Conclusion [by Robert L. Gallagher], the authors of the book emphasize the significance of women's leadership role in interreligious encounters. They are clear on this point: 'We believe that gender is irrelevant for spiritual authority' (178). Gallagher mentions many biblical figures (p. 180) in cross-cultural situations who would be worth studying missiologically. Another needed study would be of Jesus as the cross-cultural worker. The author argues, perhaps with some slight exaggeration, that 'very few theologians see Christ ministering as a missionary' (181).

This is an inspiring and well-written missiological book. Its readers are challenged: they may agree or disagree with the biblical hermeneutic, but they are in any case carefully led to see the importance of interreligious encounters in the Bible from the outside in, which is helpful for all mission theologians and practitioners in the world of the 21st century. All have their 'interpretative blind spots,' and this kind of biblical hermeneutic reading can help the reader to see better that the Bible is full of cross-cultural encounters. This volume is composed of ten chapters, which includes an introduction and conclusion.

In chapter 4, Robert L. Gallagher shifts the focus downstream a few centuries to the time of Samuel, Saul, and David. Israel, now at least a confederation of tribes, has somewhat successfully migrated into the land of Canaan but they have lost that memory and have now developed hostilities with their Gentile neighbors. Gallagher, however, argues that Gentiles—

especially the Philistines—while hostile, were also integral to Israel’s development as a nation state, from providing safety for the ark of the covenant to providing safety for King David.

In chapter 8, Robert L. Gallagher focuses on the story of Cornelius (Acts 10) and how this story becomes—and should remain—the paradigmatic text for further Christian mission. God clearly calls this outsider, much like Abraham, to become an insider that brings a new perspective to the entrenched faithful, much like Ruth. The entire story is built around the theme of hospitality, which serves as a microcosm for the entire biblical witness of God’s work among humanity. Gallagher then, in the volume’s conclusion, offers a call to continue this work.

This is a much-needed text for ongoing theological conversation. Courses Taught at Wheaton College Graduate School

I taught the following courses through a residential format at the Wheaton College Graduate School campus unless otherwise indicated. The masters' program in intercultural studies, however, introduced a modular delivery system (Spring 2012), followed by an online andragogy (Spring 2017), and finally a hybrid method of teaching (Fall 2017). Consequently, because of these innovations in delivery systems, I redesigned the syllabi of INTR 514 Spiritual and Professional Formation, INTR 521 Historical Foundations, and INTR 531 Theological Foundations.

MML 701 Perspectives in Missional Theology

Perspectives in Missional Theology is a D.Min. core course, which examines the Scripture and church history missiologically. The module focuses on the mission of God throughout the Old Testament to the uniqueness of Christ. The study will especially consider Jesus, who empowered by the Holy Spirit in spiritual practices, ministered the kingdom of God cross-culturally to the marginalized of first-century Palestine. In addition, the course will explore the progress of the missionary enterprise from post-apostolic times to the present through various mission movements.

Taught: Fall 2022 (hybrid).

MML 512 Leadership and Spiritual Formation

The course provides a theological and theoretical overview of the role of a leader with people and organizations with a particular focus on self-leadership. All leadership starts with the health, character, and competence of the leader. As a result, this foundational course focuses on fostering the spiritual maturity and long-term faithfulness of those called to shepherd and lead in the church and in the world.

Taught: Fall 2021 (online & hybrid), Fall 2022 (2x online), Summer 2023 (hybrid, mega-church pastors, Estes Park, Colorado), & Spring 2024 (hybrid).

MML 512 Leadership and Spiritual Formation

In this course Dr. Muhia Karianjahi uses several of my video reflections dealing with finishing well (types, features, barriers, & helps) and leadership development, together with Jesus' ministry to the marginalized in the Gospel of Luke (Samaritans, tax collectors, women, and the poor).

Taught: Spring 2023 (online).

MML 513 Theological and Systematic Foundation of the Missio Dei

The course will examine systematic theological themes in Scripture through the hermeneutical lens of the mission of God (*missio Dei*). The instructor will give specific attention to the development of Christian doctrines and an understanding of God's mission within the history of Christian thought and missiology. In this process the course will use the Cape Town Commitment 2010 of the Lausanne Movement as the systematic framework with a view to equipping students to develop a biblically grounded and contextually focused systematic theology of mission, which the facilitator will apply to the student's missional context and life. *Taught:* Spring 2022 (online & hybrid), Spring 2023 (hybrid), Fall 2023 (hybrid), and Fall 2023 (hybrid, Prague, Czech Republic).

EVAN 558 Personal Development and Leadership

The course examines the theological, theoretical, and practical foundations for leadership in relation to personal development, stages of development over the life cycle, spiritual disciplines, personal witness, and the leader's relational skills and practices (4 credits). In the fall of 2020, I designed a 15-module semester online version of EVAN 558.

Taught: Spring 2020 (January modular), Fall 2020 (2x online), Fall 2020 (modular), Summer 2021 (hybrid), Spring 2022 (online), Summer 2022 (online & 2x hybrid), Spring 2023 (hybrid), & Summer 2023 (online).

LING 531 Theological Perspectives in Language and International Education

In this course Dr. Runchana Pam Suksod-Barger uses seven of my video reflections dealing with the transformational ministry model: guidance in ministry; pneumatic ministry praxis; believing in the Spirit; Jesus' filling of the Spirit; Jesus' prayer rhythms; prayer in Luke's gospel; and Jesus' vocational guidance.⁴⁵

Taught: Fall 2022 (hybrid) & Fall 2023 (hybrid).

INTR 504/CE 459/CFM 694 Perspectives in Global Outreach

The course is an integrated introductory survey of the crucial issues in missions from the perspectives of theology, history, world religions, cultural anthropology, and intercultural studies. The student has an opportunity to explore their relevant cross-cultural concerns within the context of life and ministry (2 credits).

Taught: Fall 2011, Fall 2012, Fall 2013, Fall 2014, Spring 2016, & Fall 2016.

INTR 514 Spiritual Formation and Witness

The course presents spiritual formation as an intentional emphasis of the church whereby we seek to facilitate and cooperate with the work of the Holy Spirit primarily through cultivating a climate of discipleship, encouraging spiritual practices that make us more open and responsive to the Holy Spirit's activity, and developing resources that address the varying needs of persons at various places in their faith pilgrimage (2 credits).

Taught: Spring 2012 (modular), Spring 2012 (modular, Chiang Mai, Thailand), Spring 2013 (modular), Spring 2014 (modular), & Spring 2015 (modular).

INTR 514 Spiritual and Professional Formation

The purpose of the course is to explore the biblical foundations and practical implications of spiritual and professional development. Based on Jesus' model of leadership development (Luke 2:52), the course seeks to encourage healthy lifestyle rhythms in the physical, intellectual, social, and spiritual dimensions. During the course, the student can discover their own development and the implications that appear from the study (4 credits).

Taught: Spring 2016 (modular), Fall 2016 (modular), Fall 2017 (hybrid), Fall 2018 (hybrid), Fall 2019 (hybrid), & Fall 2019 (hybrid, Lumina College, Hong Kong).

INTR 521 Historical Foundations

The purpose of this course is to explore key persons and movements in the expansion of the Christian church from early monasticism, Church of the East, and the Celtic Church to the Dominicans, Franciscans, and Jesuits, and through to the launching pad of Protestant missions: Puritanism, Pietism, Moravianism, and Methodism. Our missiological reinterpretation of church history will focus on the dynamics of the expansion such as the Spirit's renewal, structure of mission, role of leadership, and implications for contemporary strategies of mission (2 credits).

Taught: Fall 2011, Fall 2012, Summer 2013 (modular), Fall 2013, Fall 2014, Spring 2016 (modular), Spring 2017 (online), Spring 2019 (hybrid), Spring 2020 (hybrid), & Spring 2021 (hybrid, Lumina College, Hong Kong).

INTR 531 Theological Foundations

Using the principles of cross-cultural biblical hermeneutics, the course explores God's mission (*missio Dei*) from the Philistines of Abraham and David's time to Jonah, and through to Jesus' ministry among the marginalized in New Testament Palestine, as well as Paul's missionary journeys to the non-Jewish people of the first-century Mediterranean world. This process develops an appreciation of theological reflection in Christian community that will affect the student's missionary vocation (2 credits).

Taught: Fall 2011, Spring 2012, Summer 2012 (modular), Fall 2012, Spring 2013, Summer 2013 (modular), Fall 2013, Spring 2014, Fall 2014, Spring 2016 (modular), Spring 2016, Spring 2017, Spring 2017 (online), Summer 2017 (modular), Spring 2019 (hybrid), Spring 2020 (hybrid), & Spring 2021 (hybrid, Lumina College, Hong Kong).

INTR 534 Mission in Acts

The purpose of the course is to model a historio-critical exegesis of Acts. Together with an inductive and missiological approach to the text, the student will discover an understanding of the person and work of the Holy Spirit who empowers God's mission. Through an analysis of the discourse structure of Luke-Acts, the class will seek to deepen our understanding of God's mission as it takes place through the apostles and the early church (4 credits).

Taught: Spring 2018 (modular, Pinnacle Teaching Solutions, Chiang Mai, Thailand).

INTR 535 Holy Spirit and Mission

The purpose of the course is to explore the dynamics of the work of the Holy Spirit and mission in relation to the following dimensions: personal, biblical, historical, cultural, contextual, and functional. The course encourages students to explore their ministry/mission philosophy about the role of the Spirit of God for their mission context (4 credits).

Taught: Fall 2011.

INTR 693 Intercultural Studies Capstone

The course is an in-depth exploration of current issues in intercultural studies. The seminar integrates core content from the intercultural studies program into the student's area of interest culminating in an integrative comprehensive paper (4 credits).

Taught: Summer 2019 (hybrid), Summer 2021 (online, Lumina College, Hong Kong), & Fall 2021 (online tutorial, Lumina College, Hong Kong).

INTR 694 Missiology Mentoring Seminar

The missiology mentoring seminar discusses key missiological essays of *Landmark Essays in World Christianity and Mission*; and approaches the topics of Life Scheduling and Finishing Strong (definitions, types, characteristics, barriers, and helps) in relation to contemporary global ministry (4 credits).

Taught: Spring 2012.

As the lead pastor, I preached the following number of Sunday sermons: 34 in 2010, 36 in 2011, 34 in 2012, 43 in 2013, 21 in 2014, 31 in 2015, and 21 sermons in 2016. Overall, I spoke 228 times within a seven-year timespan. During this period at the Wheaton Chinese Alliance Church, I shared on a variety of scriptural topics with particular attention given to books of the Bible. Initially, I focused on Genesis and Luke in 2009, and then moved to preaching on the books of Jonah, Matthew, and Hebrews in 2010. In 2011, however, my focus was towards specific scriptural passages found in 1 Kings, Psalms, Isaiah, Daniel, Mark, Luke, Acts, and James. In 2012, my sermons were in the books of Genesis, Ruth, Psalms, Luke, and John. My primary emphasis in 2013 was on Exodus, 2 Samuel, Psalms, Matthew, Acts, and 1 Corinthians; and throughout 2014, I preached on 1 Samuel, 1 Kings, Matthew, Gospel of Mark, Philemon, and Revelation. In 2015, I shared on Genesis, Judges, Psalms, Acts, and Philemon. Finally, in 2016 I spoke about the Gospel of John and Philippians with added emphasis on the Book of Acts and Hebrews.

Furthermore, through the English congregation (125 adults [80% millennials], 40 children, and 12 languages), the church supported nine pastors ordained (five from Wheaton College Graduate School, including three women, two of whom are alumnae of the Intercultural Studies program), and seventeen cross-cultural workers (ten from the Graduate School with eight alumni/ae of the Intercultural Studies department) commissioned by the Christian and Missionary Alliance denomination of the United States.
