



The Class of '65 Global Health Internship Scholarship is available to Wheaton College students completing for-credit internships focused on Global Health. Qualified applicants must have “vocational interest in the field of global health and have financial need” and be enrolled as a Wheaton College student while completing the internship. This is a one-time award. If two students are determined to be equally eligible candidates, the award may be divided among both students. This experience may occur in the summer or fall.

### **How to Apply**

Complete the online Class of '65 Global Health Internship Scholarship [Form](#). On this form you will be asked to:

- **Submit a short essay:** please submit a short description (paragraph or two)
  - Please share your interest, experience, and future goals within global health.
  - List your planned or approved internship experience as well.
  - Note: At the close of the internship, students will be asked to submit a summary of their internship experience to the Health Professions office to be forwarded to the donor.
- **Submit an expanded resume:** This document aids the committee by providing a profile of your experiences (examples: volunteer and/or community service, research, shadowing/observation, employment, etc.). Please include the approximate hours (each week/month) for each experience. You are welcome to include activities that do not directly apply to medicine/healthcare. Note: It can be longer than one page. Clear articulation of the responsibilities/skills of the experience is important.

Student Financial Services can help you identify if you would qualify for financial need.

### **Expectations for the Essay**

A strong essay, shows the reader your motivation instead of simply “telling.” The essay should demonstrate good writing skills. The essay must be 1 ½ or double spaced (not single spaced) and 11 or 12 pt. font. A copy of the recipient’s essay will be shared with the donor.

### **Expectations for a List of Experiences (Expanded Resume)**

This document aids the committee by providing a profile of your experiences (examples: volunteer and/or community service, research, college activities/clubs, shadowing/observation, employment, etc.). Please include the approximate hours (each week or month) for each experience. You are welcome to include activities that do not directly apply to medicine/healthcare. *Note: It can be longer than one page. Clear articulation of the responsibilities/skills of the experience is important.*
