### Courses Taught In-Person and Online

With more than thirty years of teaching experience in higher education, Dr. Quainoo has taught a wide variety of Communication and Africana Studies Courses including the following courses:

The teaching schedule is three courses per semester and two semesters per year. Winter Break and Summer teaching are considered overload classes.

Many of the courses have been taught online using several different programs. The major program used in 2016 – 2019 was <u>Sakai</u>. The University of Rhode Island changed to <u>Brightspace</u> 2020 – 2021.

Dr. Quainoo has taken several online training workshops. Three of the trainings include the Sakai training in 2016, Brightspace training in 2020 and *Successfully Teaching Online*- A Training Designed for Faculty of Color 2020.

#### **Ghana Study Abroad**

Along with her husband, Dr. Joseph Quainoo, Dr. Quainoo designed and implemented the first URI Study Abroad Program to Africa. The Program enrolled an average of 14 students for a summer semester abroad at the University of Cape Coast in Ghana, West Africa. The Program ran each summer from 2009 – 2018.

With the support of the Provost, the Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences and several departments, the Study Abroad to Ghana was cited as one of the most successful study abroad programs at The University of Rhode Island.

Students earned 3 – 6 credits, enrolling in one or both of the following classes: -Rhetoric of Contemporary Ghanaian Public Speeches

-Learning the Language of Twi – An Introduction to one of the major Ghanaian Languages
