Mayor Richard M. Daley has earned a reputation—both in Chicago and across the nation—for improving Chicago's quality of life, acting to improve public schools, strengthening its economy and

helping Chicago become among the most environmentally friendly cities in the world. His innovative, community-based programs continue to tackle the fundamental challenges facing urban America—improving public education, preventing and fighting neighborhood crime, bringing new businesses to Chicago's neighborhoods, creating new jobs and investing in new neighborhood infrastructure. A former state senator and county prosecutor, Daley was elected Mayor on April 4, 1989, to complete the term of the late Harold Washington, and was re-elected in 1991, 1995, 1999, 2003 and 2007. During Daley's time in office, Chicago has become a strong player in the global economy. Foreign Policy magazine ranked Chicago Number Six among global cities worldwide and Standard & Poor's ranks the city among the world's Top 10 Economic Centers.
