

Guidelines for Transfer Courses under CATC

For students who entered Wheaton under the Christ at the Core (CATC) General Education program, the following guide will govern transfer approval for courses taken outside of Wheaton to meet general education requirements.

<i>Requirement</i>	<i>Courses that can be transferred for this requirement</i>
Core Competencies	
First-year Writing	At most Community Colleges this will be Composition 1 AND Composition 2. For students who need only ENGW 104, it must be a writing course that has a significant research project and covers library research skills.
Oral Communication	Public Speaking is the only course that meets this requirement. It must be taken in person--not online.
Foreign Language	Students should anticipate taking their language 201 course at Wheaton. Elementary FL courses may be taken elsewhere, but students are cautioned that due to textbook differences, community college courses may not prepare them to succeed in 201 at Wheaton. FL courses must be taken in person; online courses are not allowable.
Wellness	Course must have nutrition, exercise, emotional health, public health and disease prevention components, as well as required health logs.

SHARED CORE	<i>Shared Core courses may not be transferred, except by transfer students who were matriculated students at a Christian College.</i>
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THEMATIC CORE	<i>Each transfer course may receive only one tag. A maximum of 4 themes may be met with transfer credit. Check Degree Works before submission of Transfer Approval Form for themes already met with transfer credit.</i>
Applied Abstract & Quantitative Reasonings (AAQR)	Finite Math, Pre-calculus, Elementary/Introduction to Statistics, Applied Calculus, Calculus I
Diversity in the US (DUS)	Race and Social Justice in US
Global Perspectives (GP)	Modern Korean History
Historical Perspectives (HP)	World History Ancient to Modern, World History 1600-present
Literary Explorations (LE)	Introduction to Literature, World/Global Literature, Classical/Early British Lit
Philosophical Investigations (PI)	Introduction to Philosophy
Scientific Issues & Perspectives (SIP)	Introduction to Astronomy, Environmental Issues
Scientific Practice (SP)	Principles of Biology, Introductory or General Physics, Introduction to Geology/Earth Science. All must have a 3 hour per week lab component done in person in a laboratory.
Social Inquiry (SI)	Introduction to Anthropology, Principles of Microeconomics, American Politics & Government, Introduction to Political Philosophy, Comparative Politics, International Relations, Introduction to Sociology
Visual & Performing Arts (VPA)	Art Appreciation, Music Appreciation, Global Music Survey. Theatre and studio art courses cannot be taken elsewhere to meet this theme.

A Transfer Approval Form must be submitted to the Registrar's Office for pre-approval for any course to be taken at another school. Courses for a major, minor or certificate must have department approval on the form.
